W. S. WHITSON WON THE CONSTABLE RACE

W. S. Whitson, of this city won the constable race for Chickasha with a vote of 1951, his opponent, Oscar Klepper receiving 1907 votes. Whitson said that this race was too close to be comfortable until the official totals were given and he knew that he was ahead.

W. A. Henderson won the race for justice of the peace at Rush Springs with a vote of 664 over his opponent, E. R. Sheiman, who received 554 votes.

L. N. Parks won with a vote of 229 for trustee of the Tuttle township over Earl Wright who received a vote of 205.

L. M. McCarty, candidate for trustee of the Bradley township, won with 242 votes over Fred Bradatecher, whose vote was 227.

NO MORE DOLLAR FEES

By their vote on Tuesday the voters of this county gave notice they do not sanction the collecting of dollar fees by the county assessor for the placing of property on the tax rolls of the county. A few months ago when the Star exposed the fact that the present county assessor had collected over eleven thousand dollars in dollar fees during his term of office a storm of protest was aroused in this county that did not subside until last Tuesday when the voters put in the county assessor's office a young farmer boy from the Bradley community. Though the state law which permits the practice may not be changed no county assessor in Grady County will ever dare collect \$3,700 in dollar fees in one year again. Those dollar fees if they are collected should belong to the county as a whole and the county commissioners should take steps at once to see that this practice is followed in the future.
