

Verden, Minco, Rush Springs To Vote Tuesday

Alex, Bradley, Tuttle Candidates Not Opposed

Tuesday is election day in three Grady county towns.

Filings for municipal offices registered with C. A. Hardesty, county election board secretary, indicated elections were necessary in Verden, Rush Springs and Minco.

Three other county communities escaped the election. Men filing for offices in Alex, Bradley and Tuttle had no opposition.

All candidates registering for the elections in the three cities signed as independents. Since they weren't listed as either Democrat or Republican nominees, a primary wasn't necessary.

All voting will be done in the general election Tuesday. Members of any political party, who are qualified voters, can cast their ballots.

Though his office officially isn't responsible for any of the city election details, Mr. Hardesty has aided the towns in preparing ballot forms and readying supplies for the one-day election.

These ballots were prepared listing only the offices where there is opposition. Those having no opponents will not appear on the ballot.

Towns having no election will escape that expense this year.

In Alex and Bradley, councilmen candidates were not filed for a specific ward.

In Verden, there were no opponents registered for clerk, treasurer or justice of peace. The ballots will carry the opponents for the trustee candidates in each of four wards.

A similar procedure will be used for the Rush Springs and Minco elections. In Rush Springs the office seekers are designated as councilmen and in Minco as aldermen.
