Election held April 2

Minco Mayor Race Winds Up In Tie; Coin To Decide

The contest for the mayor's office in Minco couldn't have been much closer Tuesday and as a result the toss of a coin will decide whether Sam W. Brence or Warren Davis get the post.

Voters went to the polls Tuesday in Minco. Alex and Tuttle to elect town officials in annual municipal elections.

Brence and Davis polled 133 votes each in the mayor's race and Thomas N. Bush received 59 votes.

Dimple Carrell was re-elected town clerk by polling 238 votes to 92 for Marie Krey. Otis Franklin Adams tallied 47 votes to gain a seat on the city council. His opponent, E. H. Masonhall, got 32. In the only other contested office, Edward Vickery was named the street commissioner after tallying 242 votes to 76 for Robert W. Farmer.

J. B. Hines, John Thomas Adams and Delvin Albers drew no opponents for seats on the council. Nor did Clyde Ingram for the city marshal's office.

In Alex the only contests were for trustees on the town board. Pearl Beardsley defeated Guy P. Hughes 120-51 for the Ward 1 seat; Grady D. Harris won over Clarence A. Rayburn, 138-36, and Art Selzer was victor over Loren Mackey, 102-72.

Dial E. Baker and Danny P. Williams were re-elected town clerk and treasurer respectively.

Douglas Roberts won the only contested seat on the town board in Tuttle. He drew 37 ballots to 24 for D. L. Cobble and 5 for Eva Davison.

Elected without opposition were: F. F. Kimball, treasurer; Norma Jean Gambill, clerk; Roy F. Marlow, Ward 1; H. O. McClendon, Ward 2; Hardy E. Talley, Ward 3.

Mrs. Thelma Sansbury, county election board secretary, said voter registration books will re-
