British Murder on Rock Island Fr Train Near Chickasha.

One of the most hideous ghastly murders on record committed on Saturday evening between Chickasha and Law

The crime appears to have been committed in a box partly filled with ties. Here a dead body was found with several bullet holes through the chest and both ears cut out of the head. The face had also been bruised as with a revolver.

The man killed was six feet tall with dark, slightly curly hair and weighing about 165 lbs. He had been vaccinated on the right arm and had a mole above the nose and right eye. He has not yet been identified.

The mysterious disappearance of a brakeman from the train before the discovery of the body leads the suspicion to him. The train crew was put under arrest at Hobart.
