Washington, Jan. 13.—Secretary Hitchcock is considering the propositions submitted by the Rock Island railroad for the surveying of the Klowa, Comanche and Apache reservations in Oklahoma. Under the emergency deficiency act, authority is given the secretary to contract with responsible parties for retaining the lines establishing the monuments found to be necessary in making allotments, providing in his opinion, he believes the work can be more speedily and economically done by private contract. The Rock Island railroad has submitted applications at a very low figure for the work, and the probabilities are that they will be approved.

Under the emergency deficiency act, that is now a law, the secretary of the interior is authorized to extend the time for completing the allotments and opening the reservation to settlement, for a period of eight months from the sixth day of December 1900.

Meeker, Col., Jan. 11.—Commodore Roosevelt and his companions on his hunting trip left here today for Keystone Ranch, thirty-six miles northwest of this place, where they will take their headquarters in a log cabin. The Keystone Ranch is owned by Messrs. Parsons and Hanson, stockmen, who reside in Salt Lake City.

Washington, Jan. 14.—The United States supreme court today rendered a decision in the Neely extradition case. The court held that Neely was subject to extradition and must be surrendered to the Cuban authorities.

The court held that Cuba is foreign territory, our only foreign territory in the war with Spain being to free the Cuban from Spanish domination. The decision was handed upon the act of June 6, 1898, which act was held to be constitutional.

Washington, Jan. 11.—Delaware Flynn introduced a bill in the House today to revise the Indian territory land twenty-six counties and defining boundaries of each.

The counties are to be numbered from one to twenty-six. The county seats are in numerical order in all counties except the twelfth, twenty-first, and twenty-sixth, which are not named, as follows: Miami, Vinita, Nowata, Claremore, Pryor Creek, Tahlequah, Muskogee, Sapulpa, Okmulgee, Eufaula, Muskogee, South McAlester, Wetumka, Wewoka, Roff, Wynnewood, Bradford, Ardmore, Madill, Grand and Atlatia.
