J. George Wright in his report says:

"The most important ruling during the year concerning the work of the department by the commissioners was in connection with the question of considering trees, orchards, etc. as 'permanent,' valuable and substantial improvements," other than lilacs, fences and temporary houses, within the meaning of the agreement within the Chopeta and Chickasha tax laws, it was held, after due consideration by the Department, that there was no doubt that the law contemplated that the land upon which the trees were planted in good faith and which were in a thrifty condition, and such as would enhance the value of the lots upon which they were grown, should be considered of substantial and valuable property."
