Hill on June 5. Chief Bowser and his assistant will visit several other tribes and make arrangements to have them join in the great council also. The chief reports that 5,000 Indians will be present. Representatives of the Ojaga, Cheyenne, Arapahoe, Comanche, Apache, Choctaw, Chickasaw, Seneca and other tribes are expected. The Sioux have been invited to come from Nebraska. The meeting is a favor to the last just before the opening of the Indian and Comanche lands, and is held because of the opening of these lands for settlement.—Oklahoma.
