NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

Nature of Organization

Rural Water District No. 3, Grady County, was created under the Rural Water District Act, Title 82, as amended, of the laws of the State of Oklahoma. The District is exempt from Federal and State income taxes of the United States Internal Revenue code. The purpose of the District is to provide water and limited sewer services to the owners and occupants of land located within the District, and others as authorized by law.

The District is a governed entity by a Board of Directors that acts as the authoritative and legislative body of the entity. The Board of Directors is comprised of elected board members.

Basis of Accounting

The District is classified as an Enterprise Fund. The costs of providing the water services to the public are financed mainly through user charges. The financial statements of the District have been prepared using the modified cash basis of accounting. This basis recognized assets, liabilities, net assets/fund equity, revenues, and expenditures/expenses when they result from cash transactions with a provision for depreciation. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As a result of the use of the modified cash basis of accounting, certain assets and their related revenues (such as accounts receivable and revenue for billed or provided services not yet collected) and certain liabilities and their related expenses (such as accounts payable and expenses for goods or services received but not yet paid, and accrued expenses and liabilities) are not recorded in these financial statements.

Cash and Deposits

Cash is maintained in financial institutions, which provide coverage to depositors through the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The District considers all checking and savings accounts and deposits with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents for purposes of the cash flow statement.

The State of Oklahoma allows government entities to invest in the following: direct obligations of the United States Government, its agencies or instrumentalities; collateralized or insured certificates of deposit; insured savings accounts or savings certificates; or county, municipal or school district direct debt.

NOTE 2 – WATERLINE SYSTEM:

The original waterline system was recorded at cost. Waterline extensions and additions are capitalized and depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Annual depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis. Total depreciation for the year ended October 31, 2011 was \$5,782. The balances for depreciable assets by major category at October 31, 2012 are as follows:

NOTE 3 – NOTES PAYABLE:

During the year ended October 31, 2011 the District borrowed \$7,250 from a financial institution for waterline engineering services. The deposit accounts are security for the note. The note is due on demand or in the absence of demand on December 17, 2012. The note carries a fixed interest rate of 4.00%. Payments of \$1,800 were made during the year ending October 31, 2012. The following is a summary of the Districts future debt requirements and the balance at October 31, 2012:

NOTE 4 – NET ASSETS:

Net assets present the difference between assets and liabilities in the statement of net assets. Net assets invested in capital assets are reduced by the outstanding balances of any borrowing used for the acquisition, construction or improvement of those assets. Net assets are reported as restricted when there are legal limitations imposed on their use by District legislation or external restrictions by creditors, grantors, laws or regulations of other governments.

NOTE 5 – RISK MANAGEMENT:

The District is exposed to various risks of losses related to torts; thefts of, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; injuries to employees; and natural disasters. The District manages this risk through the purchase of commercial insurance policies. Claims are recognized when it is probable that a loss has occurred and the amount of the loss can be reasonably estimated. In determining claims, events that might create claims, but for which none have been reported, are considered. There were no claims during the year ended October 31, 2012.

NOTE 6 – ESTIMATES:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 7 – CONTINGENCIES:

As of October 31, 2012, the District did not have any pending litigation or potential non-disclosed liabilities that management believes would have a material effect on the financial statements.
